

Suspect surrenders in Latin leader's death

CORAL GABLES — A man sought in the shooting death of a prominent Miami-area Latin leader surrendered to police Monday, authorities said.

Goldwire Anderson, 23, had been sought on an arrest warrant in the slaying of Fernando Puig, 43. Police said Puig was fatally shot Sunday after he struggled with an assailant who accosted his wife just outside the University of Miami police station. Puig died hours later at Doctors Hospital.

Puig, owner of Dade Federal Securities Co., was a member of the Florida Commission on Hispanic Affairs, the Bay of Pigs Veterans Association and the Miami Boxing and Wrestling Board.
